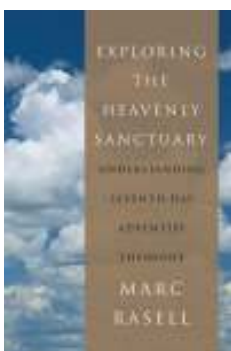

We should seek to tell others the good news of the gospel and help those in need, as well as spreading the truth of the Three Angels Message (Rev. 14:6-12) and uphold God's holy Sabbath (Ex. 20:8-11). It is because mankind is departing from God's laws that the world is soon to be plunged into great chaos (Isaiah 24).

The General Conference of Seventh-day Adventist is emphasising the need for reformation and revival in our churches. Let us do what we can to put greater emphasis on prayer, bible study and witnessing. These are the secret ingredients for true revival. We must learn to pray and seek the Lord's guidance in all matters, and to trust Him to work out our problems. As we follow our Lord, the Commander of the Lord's army will direct us and give us success in winning souls to Christ. This was the lesson of Joshua when he sought to capture the city of Jericho (Joshua 5:13-15). It was also a lesson Peter had to learn when he boasted he would not deny Christ. Christ forgave his denial and called him to "follow me" (John 21). Peter was no longer boastful, running ahead of the Spirit, but humble, ready to follow where Christ led and help the other sheep of God's flock.
